What you said (Themes)	Number of responses for this theme	What we are going to do (Actions)
Wrap Around Care – Quality of Food	2	We are working on a new menu which will be launched by the start of Term 3.
Wrap Around Care – Provision Key Stage 2	2	We are looking at ways of increasing play opportunities for children in Key Stage 2. We are one of twelve schools in the country who are working with the 'Learning Through Landscapes' charity. As part of this initiative, we have a £1000 grant and over 30 hours of CPD for staff, which will focus on developing play and outside learning. Developing play for KS2 children is also part of the School Sports Premium plan. After-school club will be included in these initiatives.
Communication (reduce frequency/ increase frequency or improve quality)	6	A new communication plan will be launched in Term 2.
Less dress up days	2	Celebrating and supporting events/causes which may involve dressing up will continue as they are part of the school's wider curriculum offer. However, we will publish an annual list of these events on the new school website. Dates will continue to be published in the school newsletter which gives families a termly overview.
Food (quality or menu offer)	3	The school has received very positive comments about the school menu on the whole. Children are given the opportunity to discuss the menu choices on a termly basis via the Listening Team. A questionnaire will be conducted via the Listen Team in Term 2 to assess the children's views.
Better informed of progress in learning.	5	We follow the national reporting guidelines but are open to looking at how this can be improved. A questionnaire will be sent to families in November to gain an understand of what reasonable changes families would like us to make to the school's reporting guidance.
Better quality club provision.	2	The school offered over 60 free or paid clubs over the last academic year. We are constantly reviewing the school's offer. Jim (PE Lead) will be writing to families this term to highlight the 23-24 club offer.
Information provided on the school website.	3	We are currently working with a website design team. We aim to launch the new website at the start of Term 3.
Understanding the rewards that my child can receive at school for effort, good work/behaviour	7	We will publish the school's approach in Term 2 via the school newsletter. We will also highlight how this relates to the school's behaviour and relationships policy. We will outline how the school supports and challenges disruptive behaviour.
