#### **Turtles (Pre-School)**

It has been lovely to welcome our new children to Pre-School and catch up with those returning! We have all settled back in really well. This week Pre-School have had a go at making nests during our "Wellie Wednesday" session. They thought carefully about what they would need to make a strong and safe nest and used their observation skills to find some special things to put inside! We are planning to have an outdoor learning session every week (in all weathers!) so please send your children in with appropriate weather gear!



#### **Introducing Wildcats (Reception)**

Becca and Sam have really enjoyed getting to know the children in our new Reception cohort. Last week, the children learnt about some endangered and threatened species in the UK and then voted for their new class name. They have voted for...

#### Wildcats!



There are now around 200 Wildcats left in the wild in northern Scotland, but they are at risk of extinction. However, a conservation programme is aiming to release around 40 and 60 European wildcats into the countryside in Devon and Cornwall this year.

#### **Bumblebees (Year 2)**

This week, we went outside to collect objects to create "patterns with nature". Using the objects, we found, we created new shapes and patterns on the ground, around branches, leaves and on logs. We looked at how we could play with the compositions, through sorting objects by colour, size, material, and type!



#### Puffins (Year 3)

Puffin Class have settled into Year 3 extremely well. We have seen some amazing learning – grasping place value to 1000, really impressing Alice with our amazing writing, exploring light in science, discussing feelings in Learn Together and looking at early settlements in our enquiry. Here we are being artists, getting messy and exploring gestural drawing with charcoal!



#### Elephants (Year 4)

In Year 4, children have been working really hard on their enquiry question – What is a rainforest and which animals live there? They used atlases and Google Maps to locate tropical rainforests around the world and are now using their research skills to find out more about the 4 layers of the rainforest and which animals live in each layer. This research will be used in an ongoing project that they will complete this term.







#### Tigers (Year 5)

In Year 5 we have been hitting our maths Place Value topic hard and using lots of practical lessons! As one example, this week we used the Chromebooks to access a random number generator to order numbers to 1,000,000.



We've also been making great use of our outdoor space and getting active. We have collected natural resources as place value counters in response to different challenges. 1) Have a digit in every column with only odd numbers except in the ten thousands column. 2) create a number between 100,000-300,000 using only even numbers.

#### Leopards (Year 6)

Year 6 we have been thinking about setting goals for the year and aiming high! Here is our balloon themed display where the children are flying high already. Apologies for the silhouettes, the mobiles are constantly moving.



In science we have been learning how to group living organisms using the Linnaeus classification system.



#### Online Safety

As we begin a new school year, we would like to re-signpost our families to resources such as the NSPCC and Internet Matters which provide information on the minimum age requirements for popular apps.

#### For example:

Fortnite has a PEGI 12 rating TikTok has a minimum age of 13 Whatsapp has a minimum age of 16 Minecraft has a PEGI rating of 7+.

Whilst we appreciate it's at a parent's discretion what apps their children use, we would remind parents that for many of these services, the minimum age requirement is there to protect children from accessing age-inappropriate content. Where it's clear that underage use of these services is to the detriment of children's well-being in school, we would follow up on this as part of our responsibilities around safeguarding.

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over		
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode		
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.		
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics		
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared		
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started		
Scabies	they've had their first treatment		
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics		
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

## MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORT TEAM

We are a team of Education Mental Health Practitioners (EMHPs) from the NHS. We work with children and young people aged 5-18 years to provide early mental health support within schools for mild to moderate mental health difficulties.

We provide:

#### I: Sessions

Talk to us about your feelings in a safe space. You will work with us for 6-8 sessions

#### 2 Groups

We provide a range of group work to assist young people who are facing similar difficulties



If you would like support from an EMHP, speak to your teacher or a member of the pastoral team.
