Dear Parents, Carers, and Members of Our School Community,

As we come to the end of Week 5, I would like to take a moment to reflect on what has already been a purposeful and positive start to the school year. Classrooms are full of energy and enthusiasm, children are settling into routines, and it has been a real pleasure to see so much excellent learning taking place across the school. I am incredibly proud of the way our pupils continue to show kindness, resilience, and curiosity in all that they do.

I would also like to update you on an important development for our school community. At the start of this academic year, we committed to becoming a *Smartphone Free School*. Following the parent consultation last year, a great deal of work has been happening behind the scenes to ensure this initiative is introduced in a thoughtful and supportive way.

Looking ahead, in Term 2 we will be launching a new section on the school website dedicated to our commitment to being smartphone free. This will provide information and updates as we move forward together. I would like to extend my thanks to the parents who have kindly agreed to join our *Somerdale Smartphone Free School Working Party*—your input and partnership are invaluable as we shape this important journey.

Further updates will follow in Term 2, including the launch of the website page, practical advice for parents, policy details, and information sessions designed for both children and families. We are excited to continue this work with you, building a community that supports our children to thrive, free from the challenges and pressures that smartphones can sometimes bring.

As part of this wider commitment, we are very excited to be welcoming **Jess Van Delft** to Somerdale Educate Together Primary School on **Monday 13th October**. Jess will be leading our KS2 pupils in engaging, age-appropriate workshops on the theme of "Me and My Screen – how to get a healthy balance with technology". While these sessions will explore technology use more broadly, they will also focus on children's relationships with smartphones. This valuable opportunity has been organised through <u>Smartphone Free Childhood</u> and <u>Papaya</u> and we are delighted that our pupils will benefit from Jess's expertise and experience.

Preschool – Turtles

We've had our first pom-pom jar celebration this week as a reward for all the hard work and listening that the children have been doing, please don't worry if your child attends later in the week – there will be a second edition. The Turtles have been enjoying playing listening games, we have had some rather tricks sounds, to identify and it has been super to see the children persevering and thinking of their own, unique ideas. We've enjoyed exploring more of the school's site, especially picking and sharing the apples that we found. The Turtles took great care in planting the seeds from these apples in safe places, we look forward to seeing if they grow. In maths we have been talking about and practicing making collections, the Turtles particularly enjoyed the collections that we made for our very own zoo. Over the last week the children have made autumn playdough, using lavender flowers which they carefully picked, mixed and kneaded. This week we have been thinking about some of the practical elements of our own self-care, including the importance of our privacy in toileting and ensuring that our pants are on before we come back into the

classroom. We've also been playing games that help us refine the movements needed to help keep ourselves clean. We have continued to talk about our fabulous families, and the children have been delighted to share their pictures and introduce their families to the class. Thank you for sending these in.









Reception - Badgers

Badger Class have enjoyed exploring Autumn and seasonal changes last week. We went on lots of walks in our local area to create pictures and crowns with colourful leaves, we went on listening walks to listen for signs of Autumn. We got creative with clay making hedgehogs and investigated patterns and design through natural resources we found outside. We have enjoyed exploring fictional and non-fictional books based on Autumn, we even found some interesting insects on our adventures. And so much more! Well done Badgers for being inquisitive and challenge –takers.



Year I - Otters

Otters have really enjoyed getting stuck in with our key text 'Dear Greenpeace' over the past two weeks. We have thought really carefully about some of the new vocabulary in the book and this week we wrote our own letters in the style of the story. I have loved seeing the children's imagination and creativity come through in their writing and they have worked so hard to remember their capital letters, full stops and finger spaces! We have also been enjoying finding out about our enquiry question 'I wonder what it was like when our parents and grandparents were younger?'. We started off by exploring different types of houses and how the

items you can find in a home have changed over time. Next week, we will begin to look at how toys may have been different, and we are very excited for our trip to Blaise Castle to learn more about this!

Year 2 - Wildcats

This term, Wildcats have been exploring the question "Where would I take a tourist in Keynsham?" As part of our geography learning, we went on a walk around Keynsham to spot some of the important features in our town. The children identified both physical features, such as fields, and human features, including shops, churches, and the memorial park. They really enjoyed making connections between their classroom learning and the local area.





Year 3- Hedgehogs

The children have really been enjoying the learning around the history of our school. Last week, the children thought about what it means to be part of our school, and how they feel. Here is a selection of what they have said:

"I feel proud as there are only 2% of Gold Rights Respecting Schools in the UK"

"I feel lucky because we have very nice teachers and lots to do, like Learn Together which other schools don't have."

"I feel really happy and grateful because we have an enjoyable school"

"Even though we have different needs or disabilities, Somerdale says yes, come and join our community."

For the rest of this term, we will be focusing on Human Rights and the difference between wants and needs.

Year 4- Bumblebees

Bumblebees have been looking at air pollution, clean air zones and traffic on the roads in geography this term. Last week we did some fieldwork and surveyed how many cars enter and exit the Somerdale estate on a Tuesday afternoon during a half hour period. We also broke it down further, categorising the vehicles. We were particularly interested to see how many electric vehicles there were. We have been making graphs based on our results and are planning on designing a questionnaire to send out based on our findings.



Year 5- Puffins

Year 5 continue to explore the amazing Philippe Petit and his wire walk across the twin towers in New York city. To get inspired, we thought we would imitate his circus skills antics by attempting our own tight rope walk experience. We have been retelling his incredible feat using a range of fronted adverbials alongside dialogue to convey character – Puffins have delivered some top notch writing already so be sure to take a good look on the fast approaching parents evenings!





Year 6 - Elephants

Elephant class have been immersing themselves in their enquiry on the British Empire learning all about how the different colonies were impacted when the British arrived. We have discussed the transatlantic slavetrade or the 'triangle trade' and who benefitted from it and started to consider the impact of the Empire on Africa, Australia and India. The children have know chosen their black heroes to write biographies to celebrate Black History Month.

Lots of our families have enjoyed visiting 'Bob' our Somerdale gnome at Cribbs Causeway.
