
Bumblebees (Year 2)


Outdoor Area - Help needed!

Logs – We are looking for a variety of logs. We'd like some larger logs that can be used to add to our barked area circle for children to sit on, as well as some slightly shorter logs and log circles that children can use to move as they love to create bug houses and nature pies at lunchtimes. We would also love some hazel rods that can be used for den building.



<u>Jenga –</u> A request from some children is a giant Jenga! If you have one lurking in your shed that you never use, we will gladly put it to good use!



<u>Loose Parts –</u> The children would like more loose parts that they can use to play with. Suzi from LtL will be back later this year to lead staff training on how we can use loose parts and den building to promote play and learning. Cable drums (good quality, and small enough that children can move)

Should I keep my

child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics



but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek
