

We had a great day last Friday celebrating World Cultural Diversity Day. The children enjoyed a drumming and dancing workshop led by Norman and Stephen, which was thoroughly enjoyed by everyone (including the



adults!). They were very complimentary of our children across the school, highlighting how they listened and followed the rhythms! We then enjoyed an afternoon of experiencing food, artefacts and games from the different cultures within our school. News from around the school

Preschool - Turtles

The Turtles have been delighted to welcome our caterpillars into the classroom, we are all amazed by how much they have eaten, grown and unfortunately pooed in the last week. It has been really intriguing to see how quickly they have changed. To support our learning about caterpillar lifecycles we have designed and matched butterfly patterns, explored what caterpillars and butterflies like to eat and continued to learn our butterfly dance. In maths we have been thinking about collections and how we can sort things in different ways. We enjoyed mixing powder paints and there were some real exclamations of joy when the children managed to make orange and purple, all by themselves.

Reception – Otters

This week Otters have been exploring sharing and grouping in maths. We have revisited vocabulary such as fair, unfair, equal, odd, even and altogether and talked about how we can use this when sharing and grouping. The children have enjoyed applying their skills in various contexts throughout the day. Such as, sharing the fruit/milk, grouping shells from our 'shell shop' and having a teddy bears picnic. We have explored how we can share equally and why groups need to be equal. Children have been confident in noticing when a quantity isn't equal and how we can group these in different ways to make it fair.



Year I - Wildcats

Wildcats have enjoyed creating their seasonal changes pictures. We have observed the changes throughout the school year and are now gathering our knowledge of the seasons to show this in a picture. You can see some examples below! We have also enjoyed exploring our new key text "The Secret Sky Garden" and have written some amazing character and setting descriptions.



Year 2 - Hedgehogs

Hedgehogs have had a brilliant start to this term. The children have been bustling with energy and enthusiasm, and it's wonderful to see their eagerness to learn. We've been diving into our gardening project, growing our own herbs. We've been learning about how to care for plants and the importance of fresh ingredients. In history, we're learning about the Great Fire of London. The children are captivated by this significant event and are eager to discuss its impact on the city and its rebuilding.

Year 3 - Bumblebees

We've had a great start to the term so far with the Bumblebees settling in for their final term of Year 3! In Geography we have been exploring maps of the coastline between Clevedon and Weston-Super-Mare, ready for our school trip later this term! In Learn Together, we have been been discussing feelings, as well as Pride month and equity.

Year 4 - Puffins

Last week Puffins completed the Year 4 multiplication check. We are so proud of every child. They are so confident with their times tables and should be very impressed with all the practice they have put in. Thank you to families at home for your support with this. In addition to this, we have been calculating with money in maths, learning all about Malala Yousafzai in English and discussing how to broadcast the impact of our zero-carbon project that we have been working on this year.
