Key knowledge:


- Postcodes are a group of letters and numbers that act like a secret address for a group of houses. They help post offices sort mail.

Our school **postcode** is **BS31 2FF**

BS=Bristol 31 = area number 2FF - the street or houses



- Our school is in a **town** - Keynsham! A map of Keynsham could show where things are. We could find our school on a map.



- We can use **maps** or pictures to draw places. An aerial map is drawn from above, like you are in a plane! We can make maps about our school and places around us.

- To find out about places to make maps, we need to do fieldwork. This means going out and:

- Noticing things around us
- Collect things from the environment and asking if they are living or not living
- Recording pictures of our environment

- If we are doing fieldwork or looking at a map, we can use **compass** directions or describe things as **near** or **far**.
