How did Fry's change chocolate in Keynsham?



Key knowledge:

- Life 100 years ago in Keynsham looked very different:
 - Houses often still had outside toilets.
 - Children's toys were often wooden and wind up with things like teddies, model trains and toy soldiers.
 - Men worked and women stayed at home to look after the house and children.
 - The Somerdale area was meadow land before the Fry's Chocolate **Factory** was built.
- In 1924 the Fry's Chocolate Factory was built in Keynsham. It took 11 years to make.
- Fry's chocolate was named after Joseph Fry. He opened a factory in Bristol in 1777 making chocolate nibs and cocoa. His family carried on after he died and the first chocolate bar and Easter egg in Britain were made in the 1800s in Keynsham!
- The Frys factory brought so much to Keynsham:
 - Jobs (5,000 people worked there).
 - A connection to the railway was built.
 - The factory had playing fields, a sports ground and a social club.
 - The Fry family were Quakers and made lots of donations to Bristol University.
- Fry's chocolate was bought by Cadbury's but eventually closed in 2011 as it was cheaper to make chocolate abroad.
