Our Enquiry Questions (Working titles!)

Term I —How should the British Empire be remembered?

Term 2 —How do historians remember the Mayans?

Term 3 —Is all of America the same?

Term 4 —Why did the Vikings come to the British Isles and how did their rule end?

Term 5 — Why rainforests are important?

Term 6 — Drama focus (Summer production)

Working titles – the actual question will be decided by the children in a discussion.



Reading

- **Daily VIPERS lessons**: skills of vocabulary, inference, prediction, explaining and summarising using the core texts, other extracts, poetry and non-fiction
- Individual reading: Children should have one colour banded book to read at home at least four times a week. This is rewarded and recognised in school with a Golden Ticket and entry into a draw. Research shows it is the single most important thing you can do to support your child.
- Reading Lunch Club to support your child's reading
- **Reading Record**: your year 6 child should fill this in. Date, pages read, comments which include new vocabulary and definitions.
- Two weekly library visits: The class visit the library once every two weeks to take out a Reading for Pleasure book to share at home.

English

- Each term we focus on a core text of high quality to engage the children and base our learning on writing fiction and nonfiction texts.
- The Last Alchemist by Colin Thompson
- Weekly grammar lesson where children are taught skills to practise in their own writing.

Handwriting: Fully cursive script. Weekly practice using the children's spellings

Spelling: 10 weekly spellings practise assignments on Spelling Shed or practise written strategies in spelling books.

Quiz and new spellings every Friday.

Bring Spelling Book in daily.

- Read and write numbers up to ten million
- Compare and order integers
- Round integers

Maths

- Negative numbers
- Add, subtract, multiply and divide integers
- Multiples factors, cubes, squares and primes
- Solve multistep problems
- Order of operations: BIDMAS




